How common is telemedicine?

There are currently about 200 telemedicine networks, with 3,500 service sites in the U.S. Nearly 1 million Americans are currently using remote cardiac monitors and in 2011, and the Veterans Health Administration has delivered over 300,000 remote consultations using telemedicine. Over half of all U.S. hospitals now use some form of telemedicine.
